## THE PARISH COUNCIL OBSERVED A ONE MINUTE SILENCE IN MEMORY OF THE LATE HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II

77. It was noted that the parish council had declared the proclamation of the new King Charles III on 9<sup>th</sup> September 2022 in Birling Church.

The meeting of 13<sup>th</sup> September had been cancelled due to the Period of National Mourning.

#### 81. Reports

(a) County Councillor Sarah Hohler

Cllr Hohler reported that KCC is working well with the borough councils to help residents with heating and bills, the clerk will advertise this on the parish website. The KCC budget is still being reviewed. The reading challenge had nearly 19,000 entries and resulted in 3,000 new library members, mostly from the new Tunbridge Wells branch. It was a great success. Lots of roads have been closed recently due to Southern Water repairing burst pipes. It was noted that road repairs are more carbon efficient and quicker now. Cllr Hohler reported that the Old Chalk New Downs event was very good, sheep are now grazing on the downs and children are being encouraged to appreciate the landscape and countryside.

Of the 12 country parks in Kent, 4 received gold awards and 8 have been awarded green flags. Kent now has a rural partnership meeting for all the parks to improve access. It was noted that the new Director of Highways has made a pledge to improve Highway Improvement Plan communications with parishes.

Bus strikes on Arriva was noted. NuVenture has been taken over by Autocar and the number 58 service will remain under a different number. School buses should be protected for this academic year.

Cllr Yates asked about the shortfall in budget. There is a £37m gap.
